

Curriculum

The medium of instruction is English and the curriculum is the International Baccalaureate (IB)

Lower KG to Grade 5: Primary Years Programme (PYP)

Grades 6 to 10: Middle Years Programme (MYP)

Grades 11 & 12: IB Diploma Programme (IBDP) and IB Career-Related Programme (IBCP)

Subjects and Course Load:

The school offers 36 subjects in Diploma Program which are spread across six groups. The students can choose 6/7 subjects with maximum 4 HL subjects.

Group 1: English A: Lang and Lit (HL/SL), Thai*: A Lang and Lit and Korean*: A Lang and Litt (SL)

Group 2: Hindi B (SL), Spanish B (SL/Ab Initio), French B (SL/Ab Initio), English B (HL/SL)

Group 3: Business Management, Economics, History, Psychology, Global Politics (HL/SL)

Group 4: Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Computer Science (HL/SL), ESS (SL)

Group 5: Math: Analysis and Approaches (HL/SL), Math: Applications and Interpretations (HL/SL)

Group 6: Visual Arts (HL/SL)

Please note subjects marked* are offered as self-taught subjects.

Exams:

Though school conducts many internal exams to assess students' academic progress, however, we use only the final exam results as official for grade 9 to 11. For grade 12, we conduct Mid-year as well as the final exam right before the IB final exams. Below description clarifies the exam timeline.

Grade 09 – Final (April - May)

Grade 10 – Final (eAssessment by IB) (May)

Grade 11 – Final (April)

Grade 12 – Mid Year (Oct) and Final School-based Exam (March)

Grade 12 – Final IB Exam (April - May)

Rank:

We **DO NOT** rank our students or calculate GPA. For IISH students from 9 -12, they are graded similar to the IB grades on a scale ranging 1-7 with 7 being the highest.

Grading:

We have different grade boundaries for each subject as per the IB curriculum. We have made our grade boundaries little stricter as compared to IB grade boundaries. This approach helps our students to be better prepared for the final exams. Here is the common standard one.

Making a Difference...@ INDUS HYDERABAD

The Indus International School Hyderabad engages students through various projects to provide right platform for holistic development of them. Some of them include:

StartupYou(SUY) — It prepares students to acquire entrepreneurial competencies and mindsets of a life-entrepreneur by the time they graduate from school and enables them to re-role, relearn, re-skill, reinvent and rediscover themselves continuously. Students are inspired to lead an entrepreneurial life, from creating a business or social enterprise, to creating an extraordinary life.

Innovation Curriculum(IC) — As part of our innovation curriculum, we focus on teaching **Design Thinking** to our IB PYP, MYP & DP students to find creative solutions to challenging & complex problems and develop an innovative mindset. We also emphasize on **Deep Reading** to make our students critical thinkers, reflective, introspective, and aware. We promoted a culture of experimentation to encourage our students to take risks and learn from their failures. And finally, we helped them to become **goal-minded** through pursuing their academic goals and contribute to the community through personal goals which emerged from their **Tikkun Olam**.

Innovation Council - The main purpose is to cultivate a legacy of innovation /by recognizing student leaders with an innovative mindset. For Grades 9 to 12, it is revival of nearby lakes. Students have already started working on the Climate Action Projects in their Teacher Advisor groups.

Community Kitchen at IISH — For many migrant laborers in the nearby areas of the school, the school students have taken the initiative to take care of their basic education, nutrition, and hygienic living conditions. To get the initiatives started, the school organized "A day of giving" every month, and to sustain the plan for providing a midday meal for over 100 children of migrant labors. On a rotational basis, the students, teaching staff, and support staff engage in growing vegetables, participated in cooking, and served the food to the migrant children.

I POWER Project – The students established **Areca Plates and Spoons Manufacturing Unit** with the help of school management to empower the women of nearby areas. The aim was to make women employed and independent.
